# **Ealing Borough Tournament**

Our Year 7 Netball team won gold medals in the Ealing Borough Tournament. They played well throughout the tournament to the final. In the semi-final, their match against Twyford was very close, ending 2-2 at full time but the team held their nerve and took the win into extra time. The team confidently beat Ellen Wilkinson 3-0 in the final to take home the prize. Well done all!



The Year 7 squad had a great start to their season, winning three out of five matches so far. The team were selected to represent Ealing in the London Youth Games tournament which took place in East London on Tuesday 22 March. They came top of their group in the first round of games showing great character. Unfortunately, they came up against stronger competition in the second round and despite playing well the team did not reach the next stage, but put in a good performance nonetheless!

## Netball

The Year 8 team has played well throughout the season and were semi-finalists in the Borough Tournament. They were undefeated in the League competition and end the season in gold medal position. Although relatively inexperienced in the competition, the Year 9 team made it through to the semi-finals of the Borough Tournament. Well done! The Year 10 team were semi-finalists in the Borough Tournament and take second place in the League competition with only one loss all season - a commendable effort! The Seniors took silver medals in the Borough Tournament, losing in a close match to Twyford. With only one loss in the League competition and one match left to play, their position is still to be decided. Good luck!

### **Girls Football**

Attendance for the club has been at an all-time high this season, with over 30 students training every week. The girls have continued to train with energy and an unwavering desire to improve.

In the Middlesex Cup competition, the Under 13s had an excellent performance in the quarterfinal match against Elthorne Park and won 1-0 on penalties. However, they faced

tough opposition in the semi-final, but after an energetic first half, the more experienced Vyners side capitalised on their early lead and took the win 4-0.

The Under 16s reached the quarterfinal of the Middlesex Cup. They played away against a strong Haydon School side and were narrowly beaten 1-0.



In Futsal, the Under 13 team were triumphant in their second tournament, easily beating the opposition and taking first place. This meant they qualified for the Borough Finals alongside three other teams. The competition was intense and due to a slow start, the team narrowly won enough points to enter the plate final. They were dominant in play and comfortably beat Ealing Fields 12-0 to take third place.

## **Boys Football**

The Under 13 team has continued to train with passion and an unquestionable desire to improve. The squad played their first match of the season against local team Brentside High School and won 9-4.

Training has resumed for the Under 15s, with trials for the squad being held for team selection. They faced their first two opponents this season in back-to-back matches against Twyford and Brentside respectively. A frustrating 3-0 loss to Twyford buoyed the team up to secure a confident 4-1 win against Brentside.

The Under 16 team had a successful run in the Middlesex Cup, but unfortunately lost in the quarterfinals against a formidable Queens Park Community side.







## **Boys Basketball**



The Year 7 boys have continued to show superb attitude in training, and numbers have increased since the start of the season. The team were dominant in the Borough Tournament in January and commendably won first place.

The Junior Boys team have worked hard this season in training to improve individual skills and team tactics. They beat Greenford in the Borough League final to claim the Championship.

It has been a strong season for the Senior Boys team. The team represented Ealing in the London Youth Games and managed to get through to the last eight. We are proud of their outstanding achievement.

### **Trampoline**



On 3 March 2022, the team attended the Ealing Borough Trampoline Competition at Greenford High School. We entered three teams into the Novice, Intermediate, and Elite competitions. The squad have demonstrated fantastic resilience, determination, and hard work in all training sessions before the competition – regularly training after school to perfect their routines. The commitment and dedication of the students paid off with some exceptional performances on the day. For the Novice Squad, this was the first

Whilst all students have studied the Holocaust and learned religious teachings on the nature of evil and forgiveness, listening to Mr Olmer made these points resonate all the more

Mr Olmer, Alois (11K) and Adam (11I) said 'What an honour it was to have this once in a lifetime opportunity listening to a captivating and incredible figure. We are moved by Mr Olmer's words and the message against war and hate.'



Mr Olmer presented to all Year 11 students in the School Hall and finished his speech with a lesson of hope for humanity and the need for people to forgive and not hold onto hatred. He spoke with great warmth of the need for civic virtue and respect for all people. In spite of all he had suffered, his many children, grandchildren and great grandchildren are testament to the fact that we can all triumph over adversity.




Big Stone Paint Project


# **CAREERS**
