CAREER TALK BY AWARD WINNING JOURNALIST, PAUL BRAND



On Friday 20 October, the school hosted an exciting talk with award winning journalist, Paul Brand to hear about his career in journalism. Paul is editor at ITV News UK, and has been at the frontline of delivering the stories you may have seen in the news or read online. Paul was awarded the Political Journalist of 2023 for his work reporting on the impact of COVID-19 in care homes. From reporting live as the EU referendum votes were being collected, to being central to breaking news stories of the pandemic, Paul is one of the top political journalists of his generation, and it was a great privilege for our students to hear from him. He shared remarkable insights into the world of journalism as well as his journey from the classroom to the newsroom.



BLACK HISTORY MONTH

VISIT FROM RICHARD KORNICKI, DEPUTY LIEUTENANT OF GREATER LONDON

Richard Kornicki is the Representative Deputy Lieutenant for Ealing and Greater London and the Chairman of the Polish Air Force Memorial Committee. On Thursday 5th October Mr Kornicki visited our school to share a fascinating talk.

In the talk, Mr Kornicki told students about the role of the Polish Air Force from 1939 to 1945, with a particular focus on the 303 (Polish) Squadron flying from RAF Northolt during the Battle of Britain. He shared archival







and personal photographs of his late father, Franciszek Kornicki, the last surviving Polish fighter squadron commander from the Second World War.

It was a moving and enlightening talk that deepened students' understanding of the efforts of the British Allies in World War 2. Students engaged enthusiastically with Mr Kornicki's presentation, with many staying behind to ask probing questions, and thanking him for visiting our school.


ASSEMBLY

EXCELLENT EXAM RESULTS


Congratulations to our phenomenal students. Congratulations to our Year 13 and Year 11 students on their excellent Exam results! Our wonderful A-level students secured 29% of Grades at A* - A and 56% of Grades at A* - B. These results are provisional and do not

include remarks. There were so many success stories and we'd encourage you to look at our University Destinations map to take a look at the fantastic destinations our students ended

up at with many students heading off to study at Russell Group Destinations including Oxford and Cambridge and pursuing a wide range of programmes including Dentistry, Pharmacy, Archaeology and Computer Science.


Our fabulous Year 11 students performed at an excellent standard. The school's GCSE Progress 8 Score puts the school aound the top 7% of state schools nationally (including those of a selective nature) at +0.67 with a

92% EBACC entry figure and an Attainment 8 Score of 54.4 (way above the National Average Attainment 8 Score of 46.2 and the Ealing Average of 51.9). Our Year 11 and Year 13 students experienced significant disruption to their education due to the pandemic and should be incredibly proud of their achievements. Well done to everybody for all their hard work!

This week Year Twelve were visited by Captain G. Searle, who shared his experiences at Durham University and his career with the British Army and the Nepalese Ghurkhas. He provided valuable information on how to prepare as a medical student, highlighting the unique aspects and requirements of this educational path, as well as how best to prepare for interviews.

Matt's visit allowed our students to have a clearer picture of what to expect in the months ahead.
