# 10. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS: DELIVERY POLICY UPDATE

Why does the school have restrictions on deliveries during the school day? We have observed a rise in parents and guardians attempting to deliver various items such as sports kits, lunches, and other routine items during school hours. This influx can disrupt the school day as staff cannot leave their duties to deliver items. It is also important that the school site is kept secure, hence visits to the premises are arranged by appointment only. Therefore, we encourage students to be organised and prepared prior to arriving at school.

#### What should I do if my child forgets something essential for school?

While we understand emergencies can happen, routine deliveries during school hours are discouraged. We recommend ensuring your child is well-prepared before school each day to avoid disruptions. In case of a genuine emergency, please contact the school office on 020 83571900 to make the necessary arrangements and the staff can organise a time.

# What qualifies as an emergency for which I can deliver items during school hours?

An emergency would typically involve situations where a student's health or safety is at risk due to a forgotten essential item (e.g., medication or house keys).

## How can we help our children remember essential items for school?

Encouraging your child to take responsibility for their belongings and daily preparations is key. Establishing a routine at home, such as packing school bags the night before, can significantly reduce the likelihood of forgetting essential items.
