

SIXTH FORM DRESS CODE

We expect Sixth Formers to take care over their dress and appearance and to be well presented at all times. As the most senior students in the school Sixth Formers are role models for younger year groups, it is important that all your clothes and shoes are clean, in good repair with no extremes of fashion.

The school may ask students to return home to change if we feel that any student's appearance and choice of dress is not in accordance with the dress code.

Dress Code

- Smart/casual dress
- No extremes of fashion

More specifically and amongst other things this means the following are not allowed

- Tracksuit bottoms
- Football shirts or other sports clothing
- Hoodies
- Hot pants, short skirts or short dresses
- Bare mid-riffs, low cut tops, strappy/strapless or off the shoulder tops
- Tights with holes or ladders
- Hats
- Trousers worn below the hips
- Ripped jeans
- Flip flops and sliders
- Clothing with large logos or slogans
- Shaved eyebrows or lines shaved into hair

In addition

- Earrings should be discreet and limited to the ears only
- Natural hair colour and hair styling appropriate for smart casual
- Footwear should be appropriate for smart casual (trainers are allowed provided they fit the smart casual code)
- Coats must be taken off in lessons.

In cases of doubt please speak to your Tutor or Head of Year for guidance. Ultimately, the Head of Sixth Form or Head of Year, in consultation with the Head, will judge what dress and appearance is, or is not, acceptable. We review our dress code on an annual basis and at School Council.
