Talk by Clare Balding



On Tuesday 7 February, renowned sports broadcaster, journalist and author Clare Balding visited Drayton Manor to speak to our Year 8 students and members of the student leadership team. Citing personal experiences and real-life stories of outstanding athletes like rising star Emma Raducanu, Ms Balding discussed a range of ways for students to build up confidence in order to overcome stress and fear. By staying focused and being creative, Ms Balding believed students could go above and beyond in life.



Before the talk, students read Ms Balding's book entitled 'Fall Off, Get Back, Keep Going'. Students delighted in this in-person opportunity with Ms Balding and asked thoughtful questions about her journalism careers and how she coped with failures. Shortly after the assembly, Ms Balding held an interactive workshop with over 150 student leaders. Students shared their views on being good leaders, best practices of working with their peers and personal encounters of leading a sports team, sky diving and interviewing an MP.


Movie Night

Every year, the UK comes together on 27 January to remember the millions of people who suffered or died during the Holocaust. FARADAY STEM CHALLENGE



On Wednesday 25 January, six Year 8 students - Alicja (8G), Mirai (8L), Aamir (8G), Maha (8L), Aeronwen (8J) and Yahya (8L) represented Drayton Manor in the annual Faraday STEM Challenge held in Notting Hill High School.

This year's competition asked students to invent something that could be used in a Vertiport, an area of land, water, or structure

used or intended to be used for the landing and take-off of VTOL (Vertical Take-off and landing) aircraft. The structure needed to be environmentally friendly, easy to use and safe. With limited time, students worked as a team and decided to create a safety tower that would alert people once a drone had landed on the vertiport using a light and a buzzer. They created a pressure pad and connected it to both a piezo buzzer and LED using a parallel circuit. They gave the safety tower a 'door', using a 90-degree servo moto attached to correx, that allowed an operator to open when a knob turned on.

After students finished the protocol, they did a circuit test of the buzzer and LED to demonstrate that their model actually worked. Although students did not win the competition, they really enjoyed the process and found it very rewarding.

PUBLIC SPEAKING CHALLENGE



Well done Kiara (10F) for the excellent performance in the Ealing regional final of the Jack Petchey Speak Out Challenge on Wednesday 11 January! Kiara was selected to represent Drayton Manor in the regional final. She attended two workshops in school with 40 other Year 10 students. In the workshops, students learned how to improve their public speaking skills and got to perform their speeches in front of their peers, teacher and a tutor from the Speakers Trust Foundation. The Jack Petchey Speak Out Challenge is a national competition that builds up young people's confidence in public speaking. Students need to pass through some intense selection processes in their schools and borough region before they can enter the grand final of the Challenge.

Before attending the regional final, Kiara was given the opportunity to improve her skills further with an online workshop and a dedicated session on the day. She worked alongside nine other Year 10 students who had been chosen by their respective schools in the Ealing Borough.

On the competition day, Kiara performed a three-minute speech entitled 'Moody

Teenagers', in front of ten esteemed judges and a supportive crowd of around 100 people. Towards the end of the competition, Kiara met the Mayor of Ealing, Cllr Mohinder Midha and other assorted guests.
