DRAYTON MANOR TRIUMPHS AT NBA 3X3 LONDON BASKETBALL FINALS



We are proud to celebrate the remarkable success of our boys' basketball team, who sealed a thrilling victory at the NBA 3x3 London Championship, held at the iconic Trafalgar Square. Competing against over 300 schools from across the capital, our

students rose to the occasion, demonstrating outstanding skill, unwavering teamwork, and true resilience under pressure. Their journey through the highly competitive tournament, culminating in a win against the top five teams in London, is evidence of their hard work and the strength of the Drayton Manor spirit. This inspiring achievement not only reflects the talent and dedication of our players but also highlights the supportive coaching and encouragement that defines our school community. WILKINSON SWORD STAYS HOME - A DRAYTON LEGACY CONTINUES



It is with great pride we share that Drayton Manor has once again brought home the Wilkinson Sword, which is one of the most prestigious accolades in the Borough's athletics calendar. The Wilkinson Sword Athletics Competition brings together all 17 secondary schools in the Borough for a spirited display of sporting talent. Drayton first claimed the title in 1998, followed by wins in 2001 and 2002. Since 2008, the school has enjoyed a golden era in the competition, winning 14 out of the last 15 events. This year, 58 of our students from Years 7 to 11 represented the school in both track and field events across two stages: the Senior Event (Years 8–11) held in May, and the Junior Event (Years 7–8) in June. Points were awarded across all eight final positions in each event, with gold, silver, and bronze medals earning the most. After a dominant

showing at the Senior Event, Drayton held a commanding 90-point lead. Our overall combined score secured a clear victory, winning by 23 points and retaining the Wilkinson Sword for another year. This marks Drayton Manor's 11th consecutive win since 2008 and a record-breaking 17th overall victory.



ALUMNUS GRACE QUANSAH RETURNS TO SHARE HER STORY OF CREATIVITY, COMMUNITY AND CHANGE


