# PUTTING OUR BEST FOOT FORWARD: SCHOOL COMMUNITY RUN THE EALING HALF MARATHON!



On Sunday 23 September, eight brave teachers and six dedicated parents took on the challenge of running the Ealing Half Marathon to raise funds for the school PTA. The Ealing Half is a fully road-closed 13.1-mile (21.1 km) single-lap course through Central Ealing, Montpelier, Pitshanger, West Ealing, Hanwell and St Stephen's, finishing in Walpole Park.

The Mozartists are a classical orchestra founded in 1997. They are the leading exponents of the work of Mozart and his contemporaries. On Wednesday 10 September, we were delighted to welcome 6 members of the orchestra to the school. They began their visit with a workshop for 30 of our Year 9 students in the morning, with another in the afternoon for our Year 10 and 12 Music students.

During the workshops, students learned more about the social and cultural issues relating to the works of Mozart. They were treated to performances from two world-class opera singers and became the first people in the world to hear works which haven't been performed since their original performances over 200 years ago!



Students thoroughly enjoyed the whole project and have developed a new appreciation for opera.


