Students receive the award for a variety of reasons which include sustained excellence in a subject, a one-off outstanding piece of work, major improvement in school work and for contributing to the school community. Students are presented with a certificate by Ms Mills who chats to each student individually about their achievements. The presentations are followed by a delicious brunch including pizza, fresh fruit and cookies.



This term also saw the launch of a new exciting award called The Spirit of Endeavour Award. We understand that students can be

In March, Xingchen (9I) participated in the UKMT Cayley Maths Olympiad 2021. The Cayley Mathematical Olympiad is a follow-on round to the Intermediate Mathematical Challenge. It is a two-hour challenge consisting of six problems requiring full written solutions. The UKMT only invite around 600 qualifying students from the Intermediate Mathematical Challenge to take part in the Cayley Mathematical Olympiad. Only the highest-scoring participants each receive Certificates of Distinction and Merit. We are very pleased to announce that as a result of his fantastic performance, Xingchen achieved a certificate of Merit. The school is incredibly proud of him and his work ethic in doing his very best is highly commendable.

students to talk to our students, including Anup Debnath, who this year



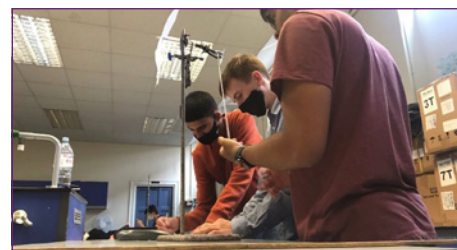

Students in Year 12 have been getting a taste of university life this week after being selected to participate in a Physics summer school organised by ex-Draytonian Alex Richards, an Imperial researcher. They attended lectures about simple harmonic motion, carried out their own experiments earlier in the week and have learnt how to code their data on Python - despite never having coded before. We have also been fortunate enough to be joined by current fourth year student Sachin Gupta, who has been guiding our students through the first year undergraduate coding course.



Students got the opportunity to present their data to other researchers at Imperial and they were left very impressed! Well done on a fantastic week for all involved.

We were very privileged to have the following Doctors and Medical students talk to our Medicine and Dentistry Enrichment students this term.

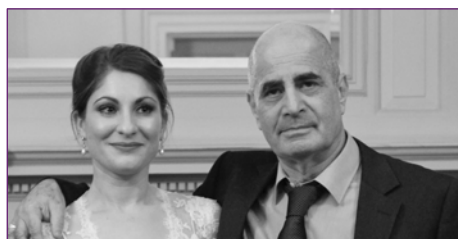

Little did we know when we returned in September that our students would not be able to start any extra-curricular activities until late March, but start they did and we were able to have a number of Inter House events before the Easter break. It was so nice to see the excitement of students competing in their favourite activities as we were able to start introducing clubs for individual year groups to work within the school's bubble requirements. Despite the difficulties we have managed to offer students Inter House competitions across the year groups in basketball, dodgeball, fitness, netball, football and cricket.
