## BATTLE OF THE BANDS: A NIGHT TO REMEMBER

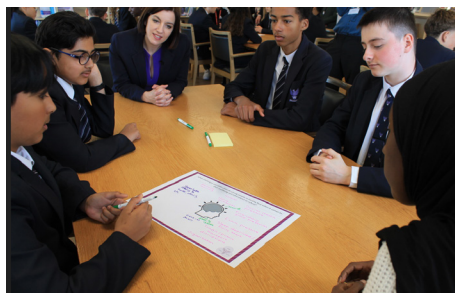
