

KEY IDEAS FOR FORMAL SKETCHBOOK PRESENTATION

- Work should be cropped using a guillotine, and mounted with a thin dark border before being stuck in your books
- Pages should be cohesive and contain works that communicate with each other.
- Titles should be small and sophisticated in nature. Avoid LABELLING your pages eg. 'Photos of Hands'
- Annotations should be small and neatly written, but preferably word processed. Consistency is key what
 you start with now, will need to be consistent for the rest of THIS project.
- You should always do a DRY RUN of a double page before you commit to stick work down.
- Pages should not be decorated! The presentation of your work should act to show it in its best light and allow it to speak. If you 'decorate' a page, it will distract from the artwork!

Crop down your initial drawings so that they are square and manageable.

Use a guillotine

Give your drawings breathing space!
