	7. What was the 'secret war' and how was it won?	 Good to identify and describe some of the key features of espionage and secrecy in WWII. Great to explain how the Allies were able to break the German enigma code. Outstanding to evaluate the significance of this feat. 			



8. What caused the USA to enter WWII?	 Good to identify and describe the key events surrounding Pearl Harbour and the US's entry into the war. Great to explain how the USA was able to contribute to the allied war effort. Outstanding to explain the causes behind the war in the Pacific. 		
9. Why did the USSR win on the Eastern Front?	 Good to identify and describe the sites of major battles on the Eastern Front and key features of that theatre of war. Great to describe the siege of Stalingrad. Outstanding to explain the reasons why the USSR defeated the Nazis in the east.
