DO TASK 1

Take at least 40 photographs of a subject matter that interests you and upload these images to your school OneDrive.


Your chosen subject matter can be **anything**, but it needs to be something you can experience in person in order to take photos. It also needs to be something that you will enjoy drawing, so choose something you find visually interesting or of personal connection to you.

Examples of subject matter are: trees, flowers, cars, hands, rope, buildings, food, pots and pans, piles of clothes, keys, bin bags, cutlery, building site, leaves, insects, trains, bricks, market stalls, building interiors, clocks, wires/cables, tools, furniture, taps, pasta, bottles, chairs, religious objects... The list is endless, and you may want to photograph something **not on this list!**

You may even choose more than one subject matter, but you **MUST** take 40+ photos of at least one.

DO TASK 3

Produce two A4 drawings in any media of your choice, of your chosen subject matter.



DO TASK 2

Produce eight A5 pencil or biro drawings of your chosen subject matter.



OPTIONAL DO TASK

Produce two (or more!) A3 (or bigger!) drawings in any media of your choice, of your chosen subject matter.



DO TASK 1 (Photography)

Take at least 40 photographs of a subject matter that interests you and upload these images to your school OneDrive.

Examples of subject matter are trees, flowers, cars, hands, rope, buildings, food, pots and pans, piles of clothes, keys, bin bags, cutlery, building site, leaves, insects, trains, bricks, market stalls, building interiors, clocks, wires/cables, tools, furniture, taps, pasta, bottles, chairs, religious objects... **The list is endless, and you may want to photograph something not on this list!**

You may even choose more than one subject matter, but you **MUST** take 40+ photos of at least one.

DO TASK 3 (Photography)

Take 30 more photographs of your subject matter but this time try to disguise what it is your photographing!

Eg. So zoomed in you can't tell what you're looking at, only photograph cast shadows, submerge/distort under water, long exposure so that the image is blurry, unusual angles that hide what the subject matter is.



DO TASK 2 (Photography)

Edit 12 of your best photographs. Think about cropping, tonal range, colour vibrancy, image correction, image tweaking. You can use your phone or other editing software eg. photoshop.



OPTIONAL DO TASK

Using photo editing software, edit a selection of your DO TASK 3 images. As before, thinking about cropping, tonal range, colour vibrancy, image correction, image tweaking. You may find this task easier after finding inspiration at one of the suggested galleries!

WTP? What's the point?

A-level Fine Art and Photography involves learning a **creative process** and developing a **visual language** with which you can express **ideas, concepts and emotions**. To do this, you need a starting point of **visual ingredients**, and this is why the summer work is important. The four 'Do Tasks' are designed to make you **generate visual knowledge** about your chosen subject matter. With this knowledge, we can begin your personal investigations in September at an exciting pace.
